Chapter 4.00
Curriculum and Instructions
Dual Enrollment 4.17

The Bullock County Board of Education authorizes the establishment of dual enrollment programs allowing certain high school students to enroll in postsecondary institutions in order to dually earn credits for a high school diploma and/or a postsecondary degree at both the high school and participating postsecondary levels. The dual enrollment program shall strictly follow all State Department of Education regulations and will be open to all eligible students.

Summer school and credit recovery options. A student who does not pass coursework in a logical and sequential order should be strongly encouraged to attend an approved summer school to earn the required credits necessary for orderly progression through the courses required for graduation. A student may earn a maximum of ten (1) credits during a year (the regular academic year plus the following summer). This includes credits earned during the regular school year or through dual enrollment, summer school, credit recovery, or independent study programs.

Grading, Promotion, and Retention Procedures

Grading in Advanced Placement (AP)/Dual Enrollment courses taken for dual credit is the same as in all other courses. Grades, however, are to be weighted for purposes of honor roll, eligibility for honor clubs, rank in class, and GPA. That is, for example, A is to be one (1) point higher than a regular A; B is to be weighted as A; C is to be weighted as B; D is to be weighted as C; "Fs" are not to be weighted. A student who is enrolled in an AP or Dual Enrollment course must complete the entire scope and sequence of the course to fulfill requirements for graduation.
